

1 And if you remember His Honor's
2 instructions, as the risk increases, the dangerous
3 risk, so does the duty, because the greater the risk,
4 the greater the duty, the more precautions that have
5 to be taken.

6 They are unreasonably dangerous because,
7 one, they are defective, they don't have a warning on
8 them. They didn't have an adequate warning.

9 You heard in the answers to interrogatories
10 from Ford, they didn't say they put warnings on their
11 products until 1980.

12 They are unreasonably dangerous because they
13 are dangerous to an extent beyond that contemplated by
14 the ordinary user in the community.

15 If they look at the product, they look at
16 the brake lining, they don't know that it can cause
17 that kind of disease, can cause that kind of damage.

18 You heard Mr. Grewe testify. He had no idea
19 they could cause that kind of injury, cancer. That
20 degree of risk.

21 Again, failure to warn.
