Flexible Range Boiler Jackets

We have a report from Cleveland that the Clark Asbestos Company is selling a jacket believed to be manufactured by Morristown, on which they are allowing freight and delivery charges on any quantity. This would be in violation of our license agreement which specifies that twenty-five or more jackets are to be furnished freight allowed, indicating that quantities less than twenty-five are to be sold with no freight or delivery allowance.
