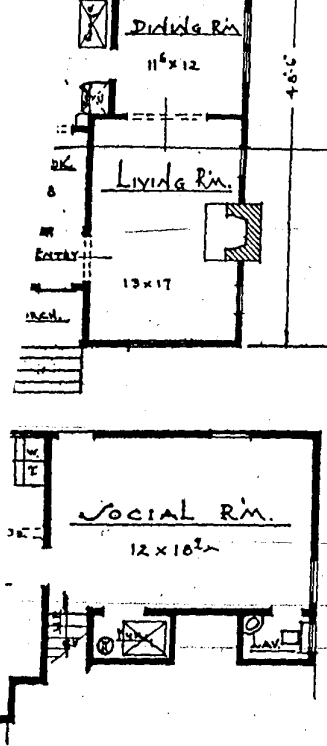




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will dedicate the new St. Mary's Catholic Church here Sunday May 12, at 10:30 a.m. it was scheduled today.
