

1 First we start with case reports. There may
2 be a few case reports in the early days. Then we say
3 hey, maybe there is a problem associated with that
4 exposure.

5 The suggestion is made. The hypothesis is
6 generated, but by itself and in itself it is not
7 proof. Scientific proof has got to come from formal
8 epidemiologic studies.

9 Remember, this was published in 1982. We
10 didn't have those four studies. Now it would be
11 different.

12 Q Well, at least Dr. McCaughey and Dr. Langer
13 felt, and correct me if I am wrong, in this article
14 they talk about the fact that they examined the lung
15 tissue because they were actually able to get
16 specimen, and they found chrysotile asbestos only in
17 the lungs, correct?

18 A Yes.

19 Q They didn't find any other kind of asbestos,
20 no amosite, no tremolite, no crocidolite, no
21 anthophyllite, no other kind of asbestos at all?
