Dear Dr. Kehoe:

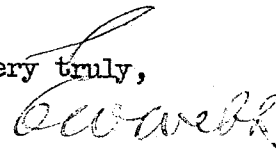
Thank you for your letter of the 6th giving me the benefit of your views regarding some feasible plan for the mixing and distribution of Ethyl Gasoline in Czecho-Slovakia.

The whole subject is so well handled by you as to cause me to take the liberty of sending a copy of your letter to Mr. Bevan, as I am anxious that he should be fully informed about your attitude on a matter of such importance.

I most heartily agree with you that in countries where there has been no experience in the handling of the concentrated material and where we most likely cannot expect to have as good medical control as here, it is all the more necessary for us not to relax in our requirements bearing upon the question of the health hazard involved.

I am asking Mr. Bevan to endeavor to get the suggested information mentioned in the second paragraph of your letter. When we receive it, it will be immediately passed on to you with the hope, as you indicate, that we will be able to develop a set-up for mixing which would be both acceptable to you and at the same time meet in a practical way the requirements in Czecho-Slovakia.
