My Dear Mr. Fitch:-

I have your favor of the 5th inst. and glad to learn that you hope to be able to make a trip East some time during the Summer or Fall. If I have an opportunity, I shall certainly be glad to do what I can to further your desire. Of course it will be necessary to do this diplomatically. I shall therefore wait until I have a good opportunity before mentioning anything to them ^(Mr. & Mrs. H.) about it in my personal letters.

I have carefully read your report on the Premier and Perma Reds. Our tests for strength are made with about the same proportions as those you use. We use 30 M.G. to 50 M.G. of color to 600 M.G. Zinc White. For a very strong color such as Grinding Lamp Black or Prussian Blue we sometimes use as little as 20 M.G. color to 600 White. For some of the weaker colors, such as cheap Chrome Yellows and Greens, we use as much as 50 M.G. color to 600 White. I do not know of any better size than Sanford's Library Paste.
