

Reynolds Plant Gets New Boss

Harry V. Helton, general plant superintendent of the Reynolds Metals San Patricio reduction plant since 1969, has been promoted to plant manager.

The 36-year-old executive replaces Donald E. Thrasher, recently appointed manager of the reduction division in the company's executive offices at Richmond, Va.

Helton joined Reynolds in 1956 as a trainee in the Alabama reduction plant. He was a foreman at plants in Listerhill, Ala., and Massena, N.Y., and served as project engineer and carbon black superintendent before transferring to the San Patricio plant in 1969.

A native of Maryville, Tenn., he has a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from the University of Tennessee. He is a member of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers and the American Society of Metals.

Thrasher, 43, has been plant manager at San Patricio since September, 1970. Previously, he was manager of the Reynolds reduction plant at Jones Mills, Ark., for four years and manager of the plant at Balmou, Ala., for two years.
