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Quorum Licenses Limit Rejected

Senate Against Population Basis Restriction.

ACRAMENTO, April 8 (AP)—Proposed legislative restriction on liquor sale licenses on a population basis was rejected today by the senate.

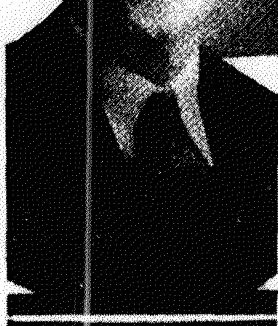
The bill, by Senator D. Jack Zenger of Red Bluff, which called for 12 votes to 18 against, similar to one passed by the legislature two years ago but vetoed by the governor.

Senator Metzger, explaining apparent change in senate sentiment since 1939, said that his former bill was vetoed by the state board of equalization virtually all its terms into effect by regulation.

"Those regulations," he added, "are in effect now, but I wanted to make them the law."

The bill would have limited liquor by the drink establishments one for each 500 of population in rural areas and one for each population in cities.

An amendment by Senator Phillips of Banning, which would have included wine and beer under the proposed restriction, was defeated 24 to 4.
