- (2) .012 Texcote BW Carton Stock

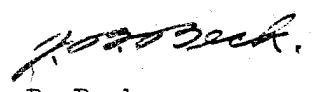
I am interested in learning whether these samples would pass the Federal Food and Drug Administration's requirements, but not including the bacteria count, as these samples were not obtained under sterile conditions. In other words, we are interested in whether there is chemical odor, taste transfer or any detectable compounds such as Phenol or Mercury.

It is not my intention that you should make extensive and expensive toxicological tests using an animal colony, but only normal chemical tests. As a further lead to the extent of the work required, the cost for both samples should not exceed \$25.00.

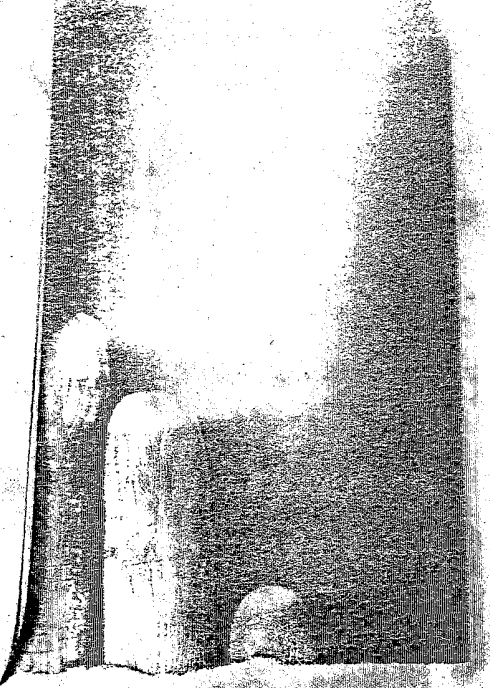

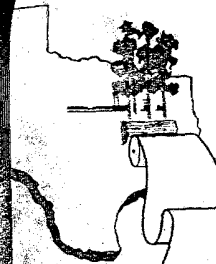

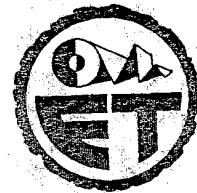
