Mr. Lincoln, Turner-Newall Technical Director, attended the meeting. It appears that Turner-Newall will be represented in the future. He demonstrated a fibre magnetite tester they had developed. The principal is the same as the Mapes. It looks promising since it measures lower concentrations and costs less than the Mapes. The Mapes is about \$1500 as compared to \$250 for the Turner. This particular apparatus was on its way to Bell Mines.

All members are concerned about the recent adverse publicity in the press about cancer and asbestos articles. Also, about the "Conference on biological effects of asbestos" at the New York Academy of Science, October 19-21. This agenda indicated that the asbestos industry was well represented.

Dr. H. Crally of the Department of U. S. Public Health and Welfare reported that the industry survey is progressing well. The environmental studies are about completed and our industry showed up well with no massive exposures. The medical survey will start in early 1965.

The next ATI Meeting will be on February 10, 11, 12, 1965 at Pinehurst, North Carolina.
