COMPANY GOLD STAR TOTAL RISES TO FORTY-TWO

Notices recently relayed from the War and Navy Departments, reporting the deaths in service of the following men, have brought to 42 the number of former employees who have made the supreme sacrifice:

T/Sgt. Donald Bahilly of the Magnus Division, who entered the military service in July, 1942, was killed in action July 16, 1944.

S/Sgt. Edward Wianiewski, also of Magnus, was killed in action in France February 2, 1945. He entered the Army in September, 1942.

Corp. Edward E. Barker, who left the Baroid Division to join the Army in November, 1942, was killed in action in France March 20, 1945.

Pfc. Paul P. Snyder of the Titanium Division at MacIntyre, was killed in action in Germany March 16, 1945.

Pfc. Earl L. Wallin, with St. Louis Branch prior to his entry into the Army in January, 1942, was killed in action July 16, 1944 in France.

Frank J. O'Brien, a member of the Construction Battalion of the Navy, died in an explosion somewhere in the Philippines March 30, 1945. He left Atlantic Plant to enter the Seabees in July, 1944.
