'First and Last Chance' Saloon Robbed 8th Time

Johnny Heinrich's "First and Last Chance" saloon at the foot of Webster street, which has become famous because it formerly was the favorite haunt of Jack London and its proprietor, one of his closest friends, seems about to become as popular an objective for burglars as it is for tourists.

The landmark was robbed last night for the eighth time in recent years. The thief limited his loot to \$10 worth of cigars and cigarettes. He overlooked cash in the register and eschewed high-price tobaccos.

The burglary was discovered by Policeman George Kroll, who noticed one of the windows had been broken.

Because the aging proprietor is in Fabiola hospital recovering

from an operation, the theft was reported to his son, George Heinrich.

Johnny Heinrich's departure for the hospital more than a month ago caused the closing of the doors of the famous old rendezvous of seafaring men for the first time since it was established nearly half a century ago—for the first time, that is, except for a period of reconstruction following a fire that razed it about seven years ago. And that, Heinrich always insisted, didn't count.

It was said at the hospital this morning that he is rapidly recovering from his sickness, and should be out in "a comparatively short time." He plans to return to his accustomed place behind the "First and Last Chance" bar.

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
