Students Register for Summer Employment

Peninsula high school and college students this week have begun planning for their summer employment by registering their eligibility and signing up for special aptitude tests through the Student Employment Service.

Yesterday, 133 students registered for summer work. Of these 42 applied take typing tests and 38 will be high school graduates this summer applied for general aptitude tests.

The tests are to be given by personnel of the State Department of Employment, through which the Student Employment Service operates.

Students 16 or over who are interested in applying for summer vacation or after-graduation employment are urged to report promptly to the employment office, at 480 Webster St., Monterey, to schedule their tests.

The office is open daily through Friday from 8 a.m. to noon and 1 to 5 p.m.

Death Penalty Faces Its

SACRAMENTO (UPI) Gov. Edmund G. Brown proposed for a four-month limited moratorium on the death penalty facing its first legislative test.

It was expected to squeeze through.

The bill, actually introduced by Assemblyman Lester A. McMillan (Los Angeles) began its trip through the California Legislature with a hearing before the Assembly Judicial Procedures Committee.

Would Close Door

As it now stands the bill would close the door on San Quentin's gas chamber to all but double-killers, twice-convicted slayings, kidnap-murderers or others who kill peace officers. It would not apply to prisoners now on parole.

This is substantially the same bill, also authored by McMillan, that lost a nearly unprecedented tie vote in the Assembly in 1961.
