Doubtless you know that the asbestos industry is suffering an attack in the form of damage claims based upon impairment of health caused by asbestos dust.

I believe it is a fact that most of the suits have been filed by, or upon the urgency of, unprincipled lawyers. Now, the picture that has appeared on the front cover of "ASBESTOS" for several months shows a very dusty condition at a mine. A sharp lawyer might find such a picture helpful to him in impressing a jury with the dusty nature of asbestos. The natural rebuttal would be that the dust is taken from the fibre at the mine. The come-back would be, "prove that it was taken out by the mill from which your fibre came".

Wouldn't it be well to use a different type of picture.
