To whom it may concern:

Can you confirm a report in the May 11 edition of "Inside EPA" that EPA and the Defense Department have asked the White House to block publication of recommendations on safe health levels of the PFAS family of chemicals?

The recommendations, which are stricter than guidelines from the EPA, come from the Agency for Toxic Substances Disease Control, according to the report.
