Dear Mr. Mittnacht:

I have looked over the samples of placards which have been designed for use on the tank trucks. One of them seems to me to be very good for the purposes which we have had in mind. This one reads as follows:

WARNING
(Contains Lead Tetra ethyl)

In event of damage to tank keep away.
Contents poisonous. Do not breathe fumes
nor allow contact with skin or clothing.
Should any of this fluid get on body or
clothes it should be removed immediately
by washing thoroughly with gasoline or
kerosene followed by soap and water.

Notify by wire, charges collect,
Ethyl Gasoline Corporation

I do not see any reason why this matter should be presented to Dr. Sayers by myself though I shall be quite willing to do so, if you wish. On the other hand it would save a good deal of my time, which is just now at a premium, if it could be taken care of by some one else.
