Gentlemen:

With reference to your letter of September 24th listing twelve items as unsatisfactory conditions, existing at this plant, this is to advise that all of these conditions have now been completely corrected, except for the following:
Item 3 - Provide hot water for lavatories in office building.

To date, we have been unable to find any small instantaneous heaters to adapt to our present fixtures, as suggested by your investigators. Therefore to supply hot water to the two lavatories in question, a considerable expense would be involved in piping and a heater, which would be of use to us for only a very few months.

In view of the fact that plans are now being drawn for a new office building, with construction scheduled to start before the end of this year, and since we have used the existing facilities for the past nine years, with no question having arisen regarding hot water, we feel justified in asking that this requirement be set aside for the next few months.

Item 6 - Maintain storage of flammable liquids.

An adequate steel building has been purchased for the storage of any flammable liquids. A concrete slab has been completed, and delivery of the building within the next week has been promised by the contractor.

Please advise regarding Item 3.
