Dear Doctor Globus:

Dr. Ormsbee, Technical Aide of the Insect Control Committee, Biology Subcommittee, has written me regarding your interest in securing the brains of animals poisoned with DDT. We have in progress an experiment in which DDT is being added to the diet of rats, but since we hope to continue this at least a year or more, the tissues of these animals cannot be made available at present. Should any die within the period during which you are continuing your work, I would be glad to send you the desired tissues.

We have in the laboratory a monkey which has for some time appeared poorly nourished, and of which we wish to dispose. It occurs to me that it might be of interest to administer DDT intravenously to this animal in such a dosage as to elicit symptoms. We could then send you the brain of this monkey. If you feel that this would be worth doing, despite the fact that the animal is not a healthy one, will you let me know which portions of the nervous system you desire and how you would like to have them preserved and sent?
