The association consists of American and foreign steamship lines, steamship agencies, contracting stevedores, contracting checkers and clerks, contracting watching agencies, and other employers of waterfront labor within the Port of New York.

Its Safety Bureau inspects all stevedoring operations being performed within the Port. This includes operations on board vessels and at piers and terminals.

The Safety Bureau has several models designed for demonstrating safe operating methods, including (a) A ship's boom model, (b) guy stress model, (c) lifting model, and (d) safety shoe demonstration. In addition, the Bureau has developed the following safety educational films: *Hand Hooks, Gangways and Ladders, Deck Conditions, and Mobile Equipment*.

This organization, devoted to research, educational, and promotional activities to extend and improve the use of portland cement, is supported by more than 70 member companies.

The Accident Prevention Department of the association develops and administers the safety program. This work is based upon the safety needs of members as revealed in studies of disabling injuries (reported on a standard form to the association), in committee and regional conference discussions, and in plant visits. Loose-leaf accident prevention manuals and other publications and materials transmit findings of studies to all plants, impart accident prevention technology, publicize the successful features of company safety programs, and stimulate safety work at all levels.

The association holds an annual series of regional safety conferences throughout the country during which mutual safety problems

are discussed and ideas exchanged. A summer safety campaign for all-out accident prevention is conducted annually, and special program materials are provided for the fall and holiday seasons.

A safety trophy is awarded annually by the association to cement plants that operate a full calendar year without a disabling injury. More than 150 plants have earned membership in the association's Thousand-Day Club, which comprises plants credited with more than 1000 successive days of safe operation.

Since the inception of the association in 1916, its safety work has been sponsored by the Accident Prevention Committee. The committee meets twice a year to review activities, to consider the effectiveness of the accident prevention program, and to make plans.
