3 of tests ever done by members, to your knowledge, to obtain
4 data on asbestos fiber release from friction products?

5 MR. MENDRZYCKI: Objection.

6 A Not to my knowledge.

7 Q What information, to your knowledge, were the
8 members of the Institute relying upon when they indicated at
9 meetings that compliance with the suggested OSHA guidelines
10 in 1975 was going to be a problem?

11 MR. MENDRZYCKI: Objection.

12 A I guess they felt they'd have difficulty meeting
13 the standards.

14 Q Right. What testing do you recall they were
15 relying upon, what information that caused them to so
16 indicate?

17 A They probably ran tests according to the way OSHA
18 was proposing in their OSHA asbestos regulations. They
19 probably ran tests at the -- at their test places, that's
20 where they tested brakes and where they made brake linings
21 and where they ground brake linings. They probably took
22 exposure level tests.
