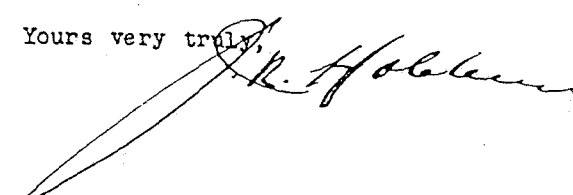
Dear Jim:

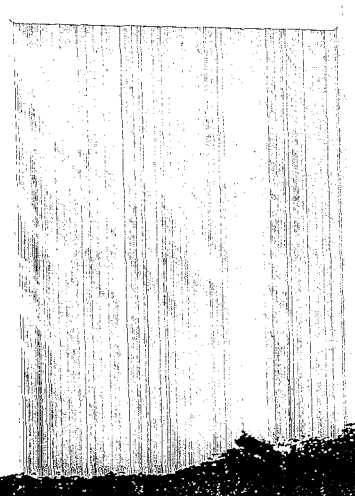

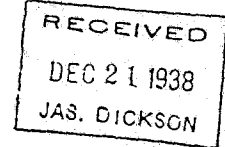

Dear Frank:

I discussed your letter of December 12th, in which you recommend that we participate in the joint advertising campaign to be conducted by the Lead Industries Association, with Mr. Robbins. Mr. Robbins agrees that we should participate in this campaign for one year on behalf of the White Lead Department and the Lead Refinery. We will make no contribution for the Mining Department as we do not produce lead ores in consequential amounts. According to your letter, our donation would therefore be \$9,764.40 for the White Lead Department and \$1,040.00 for the Refinery, or a total of \$10,804.40. Please advise me whether this is correct or if not, what is the exact amount of the donation?

The payment should be made from the New York Office and we would like to have you advise Mr. Dickson of the amount to be paid and the dates on which payments should be made. We understand that the campaign of the Lead Industries Association is for a three year period, but we want it definitely understood that we are going along for only one year. At the end of the year we will decide whether to continue for another year or not. I will speak to Mr. McDonald about this matter but think you had better also get in touch with him so that there will be no slip-up as regards the Advertising Department.

Dear Mr. Dickson:

On December 21st, Mr. Laist wrote you relative to his approval for one year for our participation in the promotional campaign concerning white lead that is being carried on by the Lead Industries Association.

I have just received the enclosed bill which has been approved and which should be paid. This bill is based on our 1938 figures and these tonnage figures will be corrected when the final data is available for last year. On a preliminary basis the lead smelting and refining department is being billed at 2-1/2¢ per ton on 28,010 tons. The present bill is based on twenty per cent of this amount or \$140.00. The white lead manufacturing is being billed on 6,904 tons at \$1.00 per ton for twenty per cent of this amount or \$1,380.80. This amounts to, as per the enclosed bill, \$1,520.80 and will without any correction to the above tonnage figures, amount for the year, to \$7,604.25. You will note that we have not been assessed for any mining operations, since they are relatively minor and since that agreement was had with the Lead Industries before we pledged our support for this year.

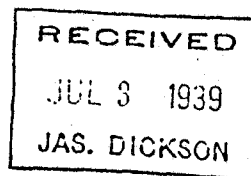
