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Record Attendance Marks Seventeenth Annual Meeting Program

Registration showed that more than 600 persons attended the 17th Annual Meeting and Conferences of Industrial Hygiene Foundation, at Mellon Institute, Pittsburgh, on November 19 and 20. Registration for the conferences was as follows:

The total attendance at the conferences was 461, and there were 495 representatives at the General Meeting on November 20.

The Greater Industrial Health

The keynote address "The Greater Industrial Health" was given by Mr. L. R. Boulware, Vice President of Employee and Plant Community Relations, Services Division, General Electric Company. Mr. Boulware emphasized the duty of industrial hygiene specialists to contribute to industrial health in the broadest sense, including promotion of good citizenship activities with everyone. Contributions accrue to the community through improvement in bodily health and attendant effects upon the emotional and mental well-being of its citizens.

Worker Health Panel

Mr. G. T. Fonda, Vice President, Industrial Relations, Weirton Steel Company, presided over the panel discussion on "Contributions to Worker Health." The panel members discussed the medical, chemical, engineering, and legal aspects of industrial hygiene and outlined their respective responsibilities for the promotion of the health of industrial workers.
