LEGAL NOTICE

ORDINANCE NO. 331, C.S. of the City of Monterey, Entitled "Monterey Improvement Procedure Ordinance . . .", Etc.

The Council of the City of Monterey do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Article VII of Ordinance No. 331, C.S., entitled "Monterey Improvement Procedure Ordinance" is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section numbered and to read as follows:

"Section 12. ACTION TO DETERMINE V. If and when the City Council, at any time after the publication of the proposed contract or of the assessment levied or to be levied therein, or of said bonds issued or to be issued therein, such action shall be governed by the procedure and shall have like effect as provided in Section 16 of said Improvement Act of 1911 as amended by California Statutes 1937, Page 1672.

SECTION 2. Said Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto a new Article numbered and to read as follows:

"ARTICLE VII. INVESTIGATION PROCEEDINGS."

"Section 1. RESOLUTION OF PRELIMINARY DETERMINATION. Before adopting any resolution ordering work or acquisition under any article of this Ordinance where an assessment is to be levied upon the property benefited, excepting street closing proceedings where no assessment is to be levied, proceedings for reassessment and assessment readjustment and bond refunding proceedings, a resolution of preliminary determination shall be adopted.

"Section 2. CONTENTS OF RESOLUTION. Said resolution shall be similar in form to the proposed resolution of intention, excepting that instead of fixing a time and providing for notice of a protest hearing thereunder, it shall contain a notice of a day, hour and place when and where any and all persons interested may appear and show cause if any they have, why the city council should not find and determine that the public convenience and necessity require the improvement and/or acquisitions described or referred to in said resolution, without further compliance with the Special Assessment Investigation Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931.

"Section 3. NOTICE OF HEARING. Said resolution shall contain a notice of the time and place of hearing, and a copy of said notice shall be published in one or more issues of a newspaper published and circulated in said City and a copy

of said resolution shall be posted on or near the council chamber door of said council. Said posting and the first of such publications shall be had at least ten (10) days before said date of hearing.

"Section 4. WRITTEN OBJECTIONS. Any person interested, owning or having an interest in real property within the assessment district, at or before the time fixed for said hearing, may file with the City Clerk a written objection to undertaking said proceedings without first complying with the provisions of the Special Assessment Investigation Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931. Said objection shall bear the signature of the objector and contain a description of the property and a statement of the nature of his interest therein.

"Section 5. RESOLUTION OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY. If no protests are filed as provided herein, or when said protests shall have been heard and overruled, the City Council may adopt a resolution finding and determining that public convenience and necessity require the proposed improvements and/or acquisitions, and that the Special Assessment Investigation Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931 shall not apply to said proceedings.

"Section 6. JURISDICTION. The resolution filed and stated shall be adopted by no less than four-fifths vote of the City Council, and its finding and determination shall be final and conclusive. Upon its adoption the city council shall have jurisdiction to adopt its resolution ordering the work or acquisition under this ordinance, and the provisions of said Special Assessment Investigation Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931 shall not apply to said proceedings.

"Section 7. NON-APPLICATION. This Ordinance shall not constitute an assessment proceeding which by the terms of Division 4 of the Streets and Highways Code, as now or hereafter amended, are excepted from the provisions thereof, or when proceedings have been taken pursuant to said Division which except said proceedings from the application of further provisions of said Division."
