Please refer to our Brooklyn inventory page 61, items Small Statements for Brooklyn and Boston, quantities 50, 1600, 250, 3500 priced at \$20.00 per hundred. These quantities are written up as sheets and priced as pads, as there are 100 sheets to a pad the value extentions are one hundred times too much. After making corrections the total of sheet #61 should be \$216.88, which brings Stationery Stock to \$1,130.56 and Total Inventory \$23,355.20. ✓

Referring to Dallas inventory page 26, items Continuation Sheets and Numbered Invoiced Sheets value extentions are \$150.35 and \$156.56. Decimal points in these extentions are in error, amounts should be \$15.04 and \$15.66. This brings Dallas Stationery down to \$121.37 and the total inventory to \$8,024.85. ✓
