Dear Dr. Kehoe: .

I am glad you included me in the distribution list of your letter of October 11, 1952, addressed to Manfred. I shall certainly be very much interested to get the full clinical story of the infants treated in the Cincinnati General Hospital with Ca EDTA. We have just treated three adults here and I am personally much impressed. I am interested in what you say about there being no need for treatment of lead poisoning on the whole. I have been troubled by the cases of individuals who will, or must, follow a trade in which prevention of lead intoxication is almost impossible. I have also become interested in chronic, low-grade less than good health of some lead exposed workers, in which doubtless the lead is only one of several insulting factors. More of this when I see you again.

I forgot to thank you as I wanted to for your very warm and friendly birthday note which greeted me at the rather disorderly, but pleasant birthday party which Manfred sprung on me in Saranac.
