He placed the cost of all the demands at a half-billion dollars for 31 principal companies.

Lauson Stone, president of one of the industry's smaller units, Follansbee Steel corporation, declared: "I do not believe that the granting of the union's demands is necessary to the effective prosecution of the war. I do believe that they are contrary to the national economic stabilization program and that they constitute a political crusade on the part of the union. I submit that small business in this country should not be subjected to any such crusade."

The steel makers thus opened their reply to the union's demands for an increase of 17 cents an hour, a guaranteed wage, dismissal pay, a fund for returning servicemen, and about ten other items.

A final decision by the board may not be reached until late summer or the fall.

SALINAS, April 25 — Arrested by police on the fire escape of the Franciscan hotel early Sunday, three Fort Ord soldiers were charged with burglary. Pvt.
