Dear Dr. Holmblad:

This is in answer to your letter of August 10, which has of course been the subject of discussion with Mr. Bloomfield. He agrees with me that we are definitely obligated to give the membership of the National Conference of Governmental Industrial Hygienists two consecutive days of annual meeting in 1945, free from conflict with concurrent sessions of the other three organizations. He believes that this can be worked out by giving our organization April 24th and 25th for their meeting, and if you are in a position to guarantee this arrangement, it would seem the wisest course that we plan to share the week of April 23rd with your organization and the two others at the Drake Hotel.

In order that you may be fully apprised of the considerations which have led to this decision, I send you herewith a copy of a communication and enclosures which I am sending to the members of our Executive Committee and to certain others.

Your very kind letter of August 16 has also been received and is gratefully acknowledged. I cannot at this writing respond in any definite way, but you will hear further from me at an early date.
