Teeth are worn but are essentially negative. There is no evidence of any lead-line. The chest simulates the pigeon-breasted type. The ribs appear to be fixed and he does not move them in breathing, breathing being performed apparently solely from the diaphragm. The apex is displaced downward from the sixth inner space and there is a soft systolic murmur in this area which seems to disappear on lying down. There appears to be an obliteration of the aortic first sound replaced by a slight roughening and there is some accentuation of the aortic second. Blood pressure is 166/88. Moderate arteriosclerosis is present. Breath sounds are roughened posteriorly and occasional crepitant rales are heard in this area, especially on the right immediately below the scapula. Faint inspiratory coughing adventitious sounds are heard in the left axilla which are apparently friction rubs. The abdomen is

COMMENT: Claimant alleges an occupational disease which began some two years ago and he has not worked since. Diagnosis was made of lead poisoning. He states his former weight was 156-158 lbs. and he now weighs 125 lbs. He states he worked for the employer some seven years. He worked in the enameling department for six years prior to injury. He started to feel
