After reading the article about the PCB problem in the Coosa River and Weiss Lake in yesterday's Advertiser, we are wondering if we have the same problem on Lake Jordan.

We live on Lake Jordan the year round and eat fish out of the lake at least once a week. Some of our neighbors drink this water after it is filtered and chlorinated. We would like to know the true facts immediately. We have fish in the refrigerator right now that we are hesitating to cook because we don't know their degree of contamination. Will these fish poison us? Is the water fit to drink?

We think as a State official you should be the one to take the initial action in confronting this problem. We shouldn't have to rely on the WIS Association to protect the people on our state waters. Will you make public the facts about the condition of the water in the Coosa River? And will you do it before the fish in my refrigerator spoil?
