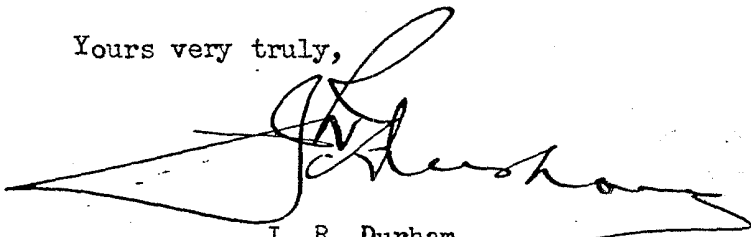

On Saturday you were called from Colo. Springs, requesting you to come and see Mrs. [REDACTED] concerning the death of her husband. This letter is written because you failed to see Mrs. Sullivan.

We have in our possession a letter from Dr. Norris and Dr. Gattler, who are connected with the New York University. They are asking for an opportunity to further investigate the death of Mr. [REDACTED]

They are making no charge for this service but make one request - "That the information revealed in this analysis be made public by them." The letter states that they have made analysis of four similar cases, and we feel that there is no doubt as to the ability of men in their position. Their findings will be without a doubt unquestionable.

We must ship the organs of Mr. [REDACTED] body this week. Unless we hear from you by Thursday, the organs will be shipped to Dr. Norris in New York.
