Defendants

The parties hereto, for the purpose of compromise only,
hereby submit the following agreed statements of fact:

1. Ervey O. McCarrell, the applicant herein, born March
3, 1903, claims that while employed during the period of 1942 to
date, as an insulation worker at maximum earnings for Armstrong Cork
Company, a corporation, whose compensation carriers were The
Travelers Insurance Company, a corporation, and The Standard
Accident Insurance Company, a corporation; The Thorpe Insulation
Company, formerly known as Plant Rubber & Asbestos Company, whose
compensation carriers were Pacific Employers Insurance Company;
the United Cork Company, a corporation, whose compensation carrier
was the Liberty Mutual Insurance Company, a corporation; the Fibre-
board Paper Products Corporation, formerly known as the (Paraffine)
Company, Inc., sued herein as Paraffine Company, Inc., and by Plant

the Asbestos Works, formerly a wholly owned subsidiary of Edward Paper Products Corporation, under its then name of the Asbestos Company, Inc., which was permissibly self-insured; the Asbestos Engineering and Supply Company whose compensation carrier was Pacific Employers Insurance Company; Larry Carr, d/b/a Los Angeles Market Refrigeration and Engineering Company, whose compensation carrier is unknown; J. T. Thorpe Incorporated, whose compensation carrier was Pacific Employers Insurance Company; Johns-Manville Sales Corporation, whose compensation carrier was The Travelers Insurance Company; Plant Insulation Company whose compensation carrier was the Pacific Employers Insurance Company and Fireman's Fund Insurance Company; and the Owens-Corning Glass Company whose compensation carrier was The Aetna Casualty & Surety Company, a corporation; all of which above alleged employments being at various locations throughout the State of California, sustained an injury arising out of and occurring in the course of his employment, allegedly consisting of occupational exposure to asbestos, resulting in the claimed injuries and disabilities to the chest claimed herein.

2. The actual weekly wages of the employee at the time of claimed injury were maximum.

3. The nature of the employee's present disability is in dispute, and the employee has returned to work irregularly since the cessation of payments of temporary disability.

4. Disability indemnity has been paid to the applicant herein in the sum of \$4,160.00 at \$40.00 per week for the period of December 5, 1956 through December 4, 1958. The amount due and unpaid to the employee is in dispute.

5. The parties hereby agree to settle any and all claims on account of said injury by the payment of the sum of \$13,500.00 over and above all monies paid heretofore, which sum is to be contributed as follows:

1. Fibreboard Paper Products Corporation, formerly known as The Paraffine Company, Inc., sued herein as Paraffine Company, Inc., and by Plant Rubber & Asbestos Works, formerly a wholly owned subsidiary of Fibreboard Paper Products Corporation under its then name of the Paraffine Company, Inc. \$ 3,295.00

2. Standard Accident Insurance Company,
a corporation *in 71*

3. Travelers Insurance Company, a corporation — 2,940.00

4. Fireman's Fund Insurance Company, a corporation	5.00
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5. Liberty Mutual Insurance Company, a corporation	185.00
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6. Pacific Employers Insurance Company, a corporation	1,350.00
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7. TOTAL	\$13,500.00
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From said sum shall be deducted the sum of \$1,000.00 for attorneys' fees payable to William T. Hays, attorney for applicant, as well as the deduction of any and all valid liens of record from said sum.

6. It is agreed by and between the parties hereto that any and all medical treatment not already furnished by the defendants herein is to be borne by the applicant only, and not by any of the defendants herein.

7. That applicant's attorney, William T. Hays, requests an attorney's fee of \$11,000.00, and has received the previous attorney's fee in the amount of \$0.00, if any.

8. The name and address of applicant's attorney is:
William T. Hays, 6331 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California.

9. REASONS FOR COMPROMISE:

A bona fide dispute exists between the parties as to whether or not the applicant in fact sustained an industrial injury

1 as alleged, It is further contended that the disability payments
2 to date in fact should be accredited to any claim for permanent dis-
3 ability, assuming an industrial injury to have occurred, rather than
4 as temporary disability inasmuch as the condition was permanent ab
5 initio. It is further denied that the applicant is in need of or
6 entitled to further medical treatment, assuming that he sustained
7 an industrial injury.

8 It is further agreed by and between the parties hereto
9 that in the event said Compromise and Release is approved, a dis-
10 missal with prejudice may issue in favor of Larry Carr, d/b/a Los
11 Angeles Market Refrigeration & Engineering Company, Owens'-Corning
12 Glass Company, and the Aetna Casualty & Surety Company, a corpora-
13 tion. Further, the parties desire to avoid the hazards, delays and
14 costs of further litigation, and buy their peace. All medical re-
15 ports now of record are, by reference, made a part of this agreement
16 as though written herein.

17 10. The undersigned respectfully request that this
18 Compromise and Release agreement be approved.

19 11. Upon approval of this Compromise and Release agreement
20 by the Industrial Accident Commission, and payment in accordance
21 with the provisions hereof, said applicant releases and forever dis-
22 charges said employers and insurance carriers, and each of them, and
23 their officers, agents, servants, employees and assigns of them, and
24 each of them, and the nurses, physicians and surgeons of them, and
25 each of them, whether acting individually or on behalf of them, or
26 any of them, from all claims and causes of action, whether now known
27 or ascertained, or which may hereafter arise or develop as a result
28 of said injury and/or employments, including any and all liability
29 of said employers and said insurance carriers, and each of them, to
30 the dependents, heirs, executors, representatives, administrators
31 or assigns of said applicant, and in further consideration of pay-
32 ment in accordance herewith, applicant agrees that this release will

1 apply to all unknown and unanticipated injuries and damages resulting
2 from such accident, casualty, event, employment and/or employments,
3 as well as all those now disclosed and all rights under Section 1542
4 of the Civil Code of California are hereby waived.

5 Section 1542 of the Civil Code of California reads as
6 follows:

7 "A general release does not extend to claims
8 which the creditor does not know to suspect
9 to exist in his favor at the time of execu-
10 ting the release, which, if known by him,
11 must have materially affected his settlement
12 with the debtor."

13 12. It is understood and agreed by all of the parties
14 hereto that the applicant herein has not received unemployment com-
15 pensation disability benefits from any source.

The enclosed Thermo-Fax of our August 18 letter to Mr. McDonald of Standard will give you the names of the men you might wish to contact. We sent Mr. Ross a similar set of Photostats, anticipating your future request. If you have not as yet received them, we suggest you contact Mr. Ross, manager of the Los Angeles office of AC&S, immediately.

We agree Social Security records do not necessarily give the whole story. However, due to the fact that the pipe covering mechanics often work for a number of employers during the course of a year, one might conceivably accumulate his entire earnings for a particular year as each employer is required to report the first \$3,000 paid up to and including the year 1950, \$3,600 up to and including 1954, and \$4,200 up to and including 1958.

We trust this information will help in apportionment proceedings.

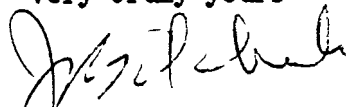
Gentlemen:

At a recent Hearing on the above captioned matter a question of coverage for workmen's compensation insurance by Standard Accident Insurance Company was raised. Our California Inspection Rating Bureau does not have any records with regard to coverage by Standard Accident for Armstrong Cork Company; therefore, we have been asked to determine if you could supply us with the policy numbers for the periods during which Standard Accident carried your workmen's compensation insurance in California.

In addition to the above an attempt was made to determine apportionment between the various defendants based upon Social Security Records. However, this was not possible due to the fact that the amounts from any given employer in one year are only recorded up to a maximum of \$3,600.00. We have been asked therefore, to ascertain if possible, relative to the periods of employment of Mr. McCarrell, in terms of days and gross earnings during those periods of employment.

We enclose a similar set of photostats which was requested by Standard Accident Insurance Company last week.

Mr. Joseph Bilchek of Travelers Los Angeles office requested in January of this year some general information about McCarroll's employment record with Armstrong, but we believe he should have the enclosed photostats. In the second retrospective rating of our 1956 policy, Travelers established a \$20,000 reserve on this claim, which resulted in Armstrong depositing about \$23,354 with Travelers.

Since Travelers Armstrong coverage only included the years 1952 to 1956 inclusive, prior insurance companies should be involved when apportionment proceedings are initiated by Travelers if it was the last insurance carrier involved.

We suggest you pass this idea along to Travelers Los Angeles office at the time you turn over McCarroll's employment records.

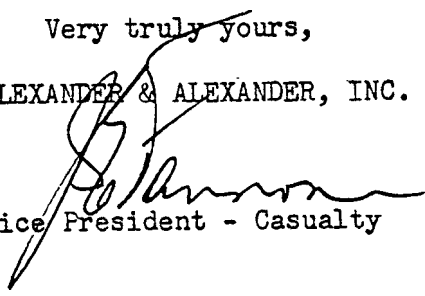

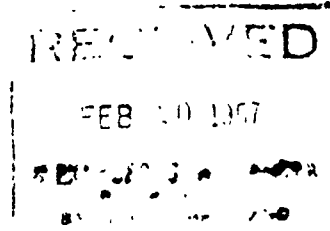
