In addition to the contract they have for tank cleanings at Cape Fear Terminal, Mr. Williams informed me that Cape Fear Terminal had leased the tanks formerly operated by Carolina Terminal, Wilmington, N. C., and that he had secured a contract for cleaning same.

He further stated that these tanks at Carolina Terminal had not been used for approximately five years, and asked my opinion on the use of a respirator type mask for this job. I explained why a respirator type mask would not be safe for petroleum storage tank cleaning.

Mr. Williams also stated that there was no history available on the type product that had been stored in the tanks at Carolina Terminal, and I urged him to play safe and have the men wear air-line hose masks and full protective equipment. He agreed with me and stated that he would do as I suggested.

They plan to enter the Carolina Terminal tanks for cleaning on June 19, 1948.
