Q What was the trouble up there at Saranac that led to your, Vorwald "Tony (Lanza) did many things for his own aggrandizement and for the benefit of industries he served rather than for the advancement of science."

A Yes. I certainly would.

Q Would that not be an advantage to interests that would be inside research?

Q. Do you feel that Dr. Lanza aided or impeded your efforts to develop your cancer studies?

A. Well, my efforts were certainly blocked & stopped, and my feeling is that Tany was in the background of this. But he is a very slippery fellow and it is awfully hard to pin things down definitely, but I know perfectly well that he got me out.
