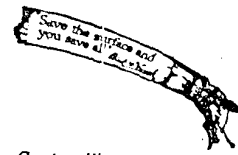

SEATTLE, Wash., Oct. 9.—The motorship Kennecott was "high and dry on rocks" at 8 o'clock this morning off Frederick Isl- and, B. C., a small body of land near the Queen Charlotte Island group a short way from British Columbia, according to a wire- less report received by the radio perator at Everett.

"The tide was going out fast at 8 a. m. and did not pound so heavily, which will relieve any danger of the vessel breaking in two," the radio operator stated today.

He also stated that the steam- ships Northwestern and Lapointe were expected to arrive to the assistance of the distressed ves- sel about 6:30 o'clock this morn- ing. Late reports stated that the crew of sixteen men was safe.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 9.—Bound to San Francisco from Ta come with sixty passengers and a crew of fifty, the Admiral Line passenger steamer Admiral Selma was reported by wireless early to day drifting helplessly 145 miles north of San Francisco, she lost her propeller during the night.

The steamer Kennecott also put out an S. O. S. call early today re- porting that she had gone on the rocks off the coast of Alaska.

The Kennecott failed to answer further radio signals, giving rise to fears that she had been hat- hit in the crash.

Heavy seas were pounding the Kennecott and the engine room flooded, according to a wireless despatch received this morning by the harbor master's department.

The weather was reported fresh- ening in the vicinity of the Selma with moderate seas running. Cap- tain Hansen advised his officers here that he was preparing to us- makeshift sails in order to keep his vessel offshore.

Information given out by the local office of the Admiral Line was to the effect that the steamers Dorothy, Alexander and Columbia were standing by the Admiral Selma.

Tugs sent from San Francisco are expected to tow the ship into this port.

No fear is felt for the safety of the vessel.

The Selma is 1866 tons net and had recently been in the Seattle, Sitka service.
