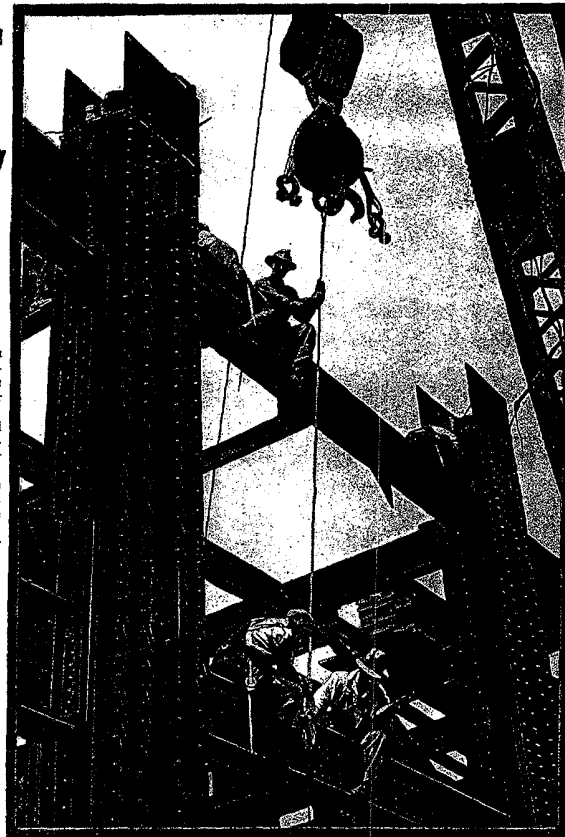

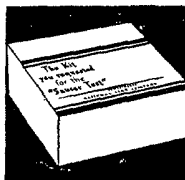


DUTCH BOY RED-LEAD
