over University of Washington

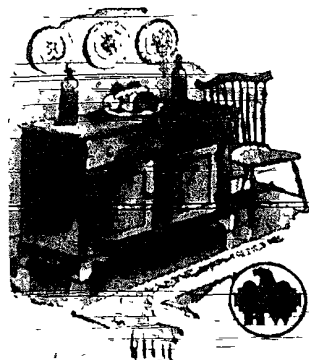

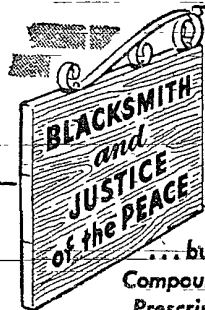
