Am enclosing the laboratory reports on the two cans of paint received from you some time ago, and as you will notice, the lead content of each is so small that it can be disregarded as a causative factor in his supposedly lead poisoning. If you wish a more detailed report as to other constituents, we shall be glad to furnish it to you but since the lead content was what we were interested in, this is probably what you want.

I should like to hear from you regarding his present status in order that we might bring the file up to date.
