On September 26, 1956, a visit was made to the Baldwin-Lima-Hamilton Corporation, Lima, Ohio, to check the conditions under which the above named claimant had worked. This company manufactures power shovels of various types.

The claimant's employment experience with this company is as follows:

A visit was made to the various shops in which claimant worked as a welder. These shops are large and ventilation is considered adequate. It was not believed necessary to take any samples of the welding fumes in the breathing zone of the claimant because from experience in other plants, the fumes would be below 1.0 milligrams per cubic meter of air. The suggested maximum allowable concentration for weldin; fumes is 15.0 milligrams per cubic meter of air.

There is no apparent source of dust containing free silica to which the claimant was exposed.
