- G. Reviewed outline of the 1968 regional contractor association presentations (Copy attached).
- H. Reviewed future need of increased liason between NIMA and IDCA, Regional Contractor Organizations, NFIAW, U.S.P.H.S., Independent Contractors and others. Also need to keep NIMA member companies better informed of current developments that could adversely affect their business.
- I. Respectfully urged that the NIMA Executive Committee give consideration to establishing a standing committee called "Education, Legislation and Litigation Advisory Committee" to replace the present informally organized "Education Subcommittee". Present circumstances indicate that the need for education, information and communications; especially relating to health, safety, workman's compensation, commonlaw litigation, public hearings, legislation, congressional hearings, etc., will substantially increase in the future.

During the foregoing presentation, a member of the group made the suggestion that a representative of the Public Relations Committee of NIMA sit in on each Education Subcommittee meeting in order to gather information for publication in the IDCA Newsletter. This suggestion is respectfully rejected due to confidential nature of subjects discussed. We will, however, periodically invite attendance of Public Relations representation and/or prepare suitable material for them.

REPORT OF LEGAL COUNSEL

Mr. Bayer reported on recent suits brought by the anti-trust enforcement agencies against protect or market extension mergers and discussed the criteria applied by the agencies in determining whether to bring suit, including existence of potential competition, vertical market foreclosure and opportunities for trade reciprocity.

Counsel also reviewed the decision of the United States Supreme Court in the Schwinn case concerning the legality of territorial and other restraints on distributors and noted the distinction made by the Court with respect to distributors taking title to goods and risk of loss as against distributors selling on commission as agent for the manufacturer.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
