Dear Mr. Hettinger:

I have your letter of January 13, with the request that we examine one [REDACTED], employed by you and referred to in previous correspondence.

We shall be very glad to see Mr. [REDACTED], to examine him, and report on our findings of his condition. Considering the length of time elapsed since he has been in your employ, it will be a little difficult to establish any connection between any possible lead exposure he may have had then, and his exposure now. However, we shall do our best to arrive at a diagnosis. I would suggest that the most convenient time for ^{pur}poses would be some time in the first week of February, (the week beginning Monday, January 31). Any day in this week would be convenient, except Monday or Wednesday. I presume Mr. [REDACTED] would be coming on a train and that he would come to the Laboratory in a taxicab. It is important that he or whoever would accompany him, would be instructed to tell the driver to bring him to the College of Medicine, Eden Avenue, in Cincinnati, being sure not to make mention of the name of the University of Cincinnati. I make specific point of this, since if he mentions the University of Cincinnati, he will be sure to be taken to the University campus, which is quite some distance from the Medical College.
