Dear Mr. Mittnacht:

I have received your letter of May 10 with the memorandum as to the preparation of a manual for field representatives of the Ethyl Gasoline Corporation. I shall prepare my material for this manual at once. I am interested in knowing, however, what is planned in the way of discussion of mixing equipments. As you know, I have been collecting suggestions on this subject from various ones of your representatives with the idea of making slight modifications, improvements, and eliminations in the rules and regulations, and also with the idea of standardizing to whatever degree is possible the mixing equipments in various parts of the country. Is it proposed in the present manual to instruct your men as to how to proceed to install a suitable equipment, or is that to be left for another manual? Or is it your intention to include in this complete instructions as to our specifications in this matter, and as to what the requirements of my department are? If you wish to do the latter I think it would be a good idea if I discussed the whole matter of mixing equipments with Mr. Walter.

If you will let me know what your reaction is to this I will get together all the material I have.
