

p.25-7 – Crane Document repositories

- a. NYC (aka Despatch – p. 60) – repository for corp ops in NYC (prior to move to CT in 1992)
- b. CT (aka Meyers – p. 60) – ops since 1992 move from NYC
- c. Bolingbrook, IL – mostly Crane valve drawings
- d. Freehold, NJ (Iron Mountain) – central repository where asbestos litigation docs are kept. Also records of Crane Co.'s previous ops and mfg facilities that were either divested or closed.

p.33 – Crane's first asbestos case was in 1983

p. 50 – Crane co witness in Bollingbrook, IL Pat Bahland. She was involved as a sales supervisor or supervisor of inhouse sales.

p. 53-4 – some Crane Co Supply docs were sent to the corporate repositories, including Freehold, NJ.

p. 54-6 – Crane has a discovery database of all prior discovery searches it has performed.

p. 59-66 – Description of Crane's data collection system.

p. 68 – Bollingbrook has ship records and drawings (previously on microfiche, but they are working on a scanning system)

p. 78 – founded in 1855

p. 87 – Crane Supply was part of Crane Co. (and not a separate co.)

p. 93 – has seen Crane Co. slogan "One source of supply, one responsibility, one standard of quality" (Exh. 5

p. 97-8; 103 – Crane Supply could have sold products not in the catalogs (does not include all A/C pipe or all boilers)

p. 108 – Crane Supply in Salinas was sold to Keenan in 1971.

p. 110-1 – Exh. 6 was compiled by legal regarding when Crane Supply branches closed.

p. 136 – Crane Supply sold asbestos insulation

p. 139 – sold Cranite sheet packing from around 1920 to the mid 1970s mfg by Goodyear and Goodrich

p. 140 – Cranite always contained between 75 and 85% asbestos

p. 141-143 – Goodyear and Goodrich had a spec they had to meet for Cranite (Exh. 10).

p. 153 – prior to the mid 1950s, some boilers had asbestos insulation under the jackets.

p. 154 – from 1960-68 Crane Co. manufactured Pacific boilers. In 1960, Crane Co. bought US/National and Cyclotherm, National and Pacific came with the acquisition.
