The Asbestosis Fund

Report for the year to
 30th September 1946

The following statistical statements are attached hereto, showing details of contributions, compensation payments, etc., for the above year, namely:-

1. Statement of Contributions
2. Summary of Claims and Compensation Paid
3. Analysis of Claims submitted
4. Statement of Medical Costs
5. Detailed Statements of claims made by workpeople

On pages 4 to 7 hereof will be found certain particulars extracted from these statistical statements, together with comments on various points submitted for the information of the Board. In addition, I think it will be of advantage particularly to draw the attention of the Board to the following points:-

1. Rates of Contributions to the Fund

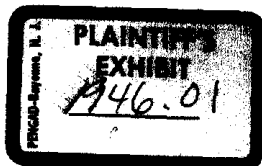
The fact that the compensation payments for the last three years have been at a high level and that in consequence the balance in the Fund has been substantially reduced, whereas the balance was 223,708 at September 1942 and 219,389 at September 1944, it was only 211,042 at 30th September 1946.

In this connection it will be noted (see page 3 hereof) that the balance held in the Fund on behalf of J. W. Roberts Ltd. is only 21,625 and that that Company has 19 current claims; this point was considered by the Board last year and it was decided not to make any increase in the rate of contribution by J.W.R.Ltd. on that occasion.

The existence of a debit balance in the Fund in the case of Newalls Insulation Co. Ltd. is explained by the fact that that Company only recently began to pay contributions to the Fund, and the bulk of the payments made thereout on its behalf have been in respect of ex-employees of Reid McFarlane & Co. Ltd. and Hobdell, Way & Co. Ltd.

As the balance in the fund has fallen so substantially during the last three years the Board will presumably wish to consider whether any changes in the rates of contributions to the Fund should be made. For their convenience the present rates, which also appear in Statement No.1, are set out below:-

With regard to the above list, Farodo Ltd. have contributed to Fund 'A' since 1st October 1944 and Newalls Insulation Co. Ltd. have contributed to Fund 'B' since 1st October 1943, and except to that extent the present contribution rates have been in operation since 1st October 1940; at that date the balance in the Fund was £24,908 and the contributions were accordingly reduced. Prior to 1st October 1940 the contributions in the case of Fund 'A' were at the rate of 5% for J. W. Roberts Ltd. and 1½% for the other Unit Companies concerned, and the contributions to Fund 'B' were at the rate of ½%.

In considering the adequacy of the Fund and the rates of contribution thereto, the fact that under the National Health (Industrial Injuries) Act 1946 responsibility for asbestosis cases arising in the future will eventually be taken by the State requires to be borne in mind, but this will not affect our responsibility for existing cases; and moreover the Act may not be fully in operation for another two years or so.

It will be noted from Statement No.1 that the contributions for the year to 30th September 1946, calculated of course at the existing rates, amounted in all to £3,043.16. Od., and if the number of employees in respect of whom contributions are made to the Fund remains relatively constant during the present year, an additional £3,000 or so would therefore be received if, for instance, the contribution rates were doubled, which would mean reverting to the rates in force prior to 1st October 1940.

2. Asbestosis Regulations - Insulation
Contract Work on board ship

On the occasion of the annual report submitted to the Board a year ago I drew attention to the letter received from the Chief Inspector of Factories by J. W. Roberts Ltd. as to the risk of asbestosis amongst employees engaged on insulation contract work on board ship, and reported that a long reply had been sent by Turner & Newall Ltd., explaining the position and pointing out that in fact no asbestosis cases had occurred amongst N.I.Co.Ltd's contract employees. No reply was received from the Chief Factory Inspector and nothing further has occurred with regard to this question. The fact, however, that several asbestosis cases amongst W.C.Co.Ltd's and N.I.Co.Ltd's employees have occurred since last year's report, as mentioned below, requires to be borne in mind in this connection.

3. W.C.Co.Ltd. and N.I.Co.Ltd.

The statistical information now submitted to the Board only relates to cases where the negotiations necessary after the

original making of a claim have been completed prior to 31st September 1946. Certain new claims which have only recently been received are not, therefore, yet included in these statistics. They include two employees of W.C.Co. Ltd., in whose cases the Medical Board have issued certificates that the illness in one case and the death in the other were due to asbestosis. These two employees had 21 and 25 years' service as a Foreman and as a loader respectively in the Insulation Division at Washington. In addition, the deaths of two employees of N.I.Co.Ltd. (father and son) have been certified by the Medical Board as due to asbestosis and tuberculosis, and these two claims are now under negotiation. The son was only 17 years of age at the date of death and had only been employed by N.I.Co.Ltd. as an apprentice for two years. In view of the fact that the Factory Inspector present at the inquests on the two employees of N.I.Co.Ltd. was Miss Vickors, who used to be the Factory Inspector in Roudale and has therefore previous experience of asbestosis cases, it seems likely that any report she may have made to the Home Office may accelerate the revision of the Asbestosis Regulations, which we have for some time been expecting to occur.

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Summary

Of necessity the statistical information submitted to the Board each year is somewhat substantial in volume, and the following figures may be of some assistance in providing a short summary of the position within the Group as a whole since 1931:-

From the above it will be noted that there is little variation in the contributions for the year under review as compared with the previous year, but the payments of compensation at 27,440 are, as in the two previous years, well in excess of the contributions, with the result that the balance of the fund has been reduced during the year from 21,552 to 11,049. After deducting 29,720 in respect of final payments made during the last five years as referred to in detail below, the normal compensation payments exceed the contributions by 25,239 for the five years to 30th September 1946. The higher compensation payments during the past year are largely due to the fact that since 30th September 1945 there have been seven cases in which lump sum settlements have been made, the total amount involved being 23,002 in respect of the following cases - final settlements having been made after the deaths of these employees except in the case of J. J. Grimshaw whose case has been settled in his lifetime:-

From Statement No.3 it will be noted that during the year nine cases were finally disposed of, including the seven mentioned above. In respect of the other two cases - R. Dennison (T.B.A.Co.Ltd.) and J. Greenamith (J.W.R.Ltd.) - no final payments were made, death not being due to asbestosis.

The balance of the fund applicable to J.W.R.Ltd. has decreased from £1,968 at 30th September 1945 to £1,625 at 30th September 1946. Last year there were 17 outstanding claims for this Company, but during the year ended 30th September 1946 three new claims were submitted and one settled, making a total of 19 outstanding claims, with a balance of £1,625 available.

The general question of the strength of the Fund and the rate of contributions thereto is raised earlier in this report for consideration by the Board.

The above cases have all been certified as partially disabled, and it will be noted that in all instances the claimants have had long periods of service up to the date of certification. The above cases now bring the total number of claims to date to 122 spread over a period of 15 years.

From the above it will be seen that the number of examinations carried out during the past year has increased in comparison with the previous year, but it is understood that the Medical Board is still considerably in arrears with its examinations.

The total cost to date of examinations and the issue of disablement and death certificates is £13,232. 7. Od., covering a period of 15 years from 1st October 1931.
