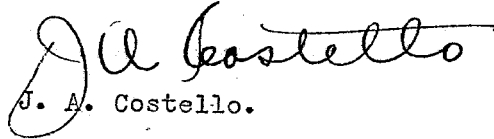
Dear Dr. Kehoe,
