MUSCULAR YOUNG Bob Work, the former Pacific Grove High School and Hartnell College (Salinas) ace, worked 100 yards in the UCLA-Santa Barbara College track meet last week in 97.

Needless to add, Work won the dash and tied the Bruin school mark for the distance.

Bob is now rated a "star" in the century.

In the same meet he took a couple of cracks at broad jumping. More or less unfamiliar with the techniques, the UCLA athlete made one leap of 21 feet, three and one-half inches and then joined his mother, Mrs. Dan Danziger, on the sidelines.

Not expecting favorable results, he was surprised to hear his name announced as "third place winner."

Bob's father, T. A. Work, Jr., was quite a track man in his youth too.

The elder Junior joined hands with a fellow Pacific Grove Breaker, Mahoney, to win the North Coast Section high school championship in 1923.

The victory was truly a two-man affair, since Mahoney and Work were the only Breakers to manufacture any points.

Work copped the high jump (setting a new NCS record) and the high hurdles, while Mahoney took the miles and the half-mile runs. The wins gave Pacific Grove 20 points, enough to come back from Stanford with the championship.

Bob Work, incidentally, matriculated (one quarter) at Leland Stanford's farm. He is expected to cost his former school points when the Indians tangle with the Bruins in a Conference meet today.

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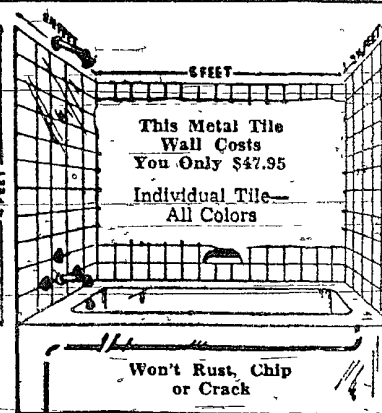
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
