SUBJECT: Mrs. Dora Nell Todd, Deceased

As you probably know by now, we lost Mrs. Todd on April 18. We learned a hard lesson in a very sad way.

Mr. Todd had previously requested of her husband and of Dr. Neely that an autopsy be made if she should die, for she felt that the doctors, by such an examination, might find something to help her husband or others in the Asbeston plant. Therefore, a post-mortem was made. Enclosed is a photostatic copy of Dr. Neely's initial report. It is my understanding that we shall receive later a complete report of the pathological findings.

Dr. Wells has already contacted Dr. Neely, and we also expect a report from him.

Your report of April 28 on the visit of Dr. Kenneth E. Smith is most interesting, and we will contact you later about it after we have reviewed your report with Mr. Sullivan. Incidentally, Dr. Wells plans to arrange a get-together with Dr. Kenneth Lynch, Sr., probably at Charleston.
