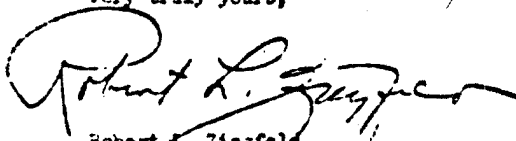
To Members of the Lead Industries Association:
