Dear Mr. Boyd:

This will reply to your letter dated September 20, 1960, addressed to Employers Reinsurance Corporation, showing the above reference. We have included a photostat copy of an unsigned endorsement for Policy No. WC-5904001 which deletes the names of Shell Development Company and Shell Chemical Corporation from that policy.

As at the close of business on December 31, 1959, Shell Chemical Corporation and Shell Development Company, Delaware corporations, and wholly owned subsidiaries of Shell Oil Company, a Delaware corporation, were merged into Shell Oil Company which was the survivor corporation.

The former employees of Shell Chemical Corporation and Shell Development Company automatically became employees of Shell Oil Company. Therefore, the name of insured on renewal policy No. WC-6004001, issued by Employers Reinsurance Corporation, is properly listed as Shell Oil Company and/or Shell Pipe Line Corporation.

We trust this explanation is sufficient to clarify the points raised with Employers Reinsurance Corporation and that the unexecuted copy of this endorsement will suffice. If not, please contact us and we will attempt to secure an executed copy of the endorsement.
