Dear Dr. Lanza:

Dean McEwen has told me of Mr. Ecker's reply to Chancellor Chase saying that he looks favorably on having you accept the professorship of Industrial Medicine, perhaps on a part-time basis for the first year. Needless to say I am as pleased as Dean McEwen and the rest of our faculty are at this prospect. Nothing could be more inspiring than your enthusiasm to crown your career with the creation of this important unit in our new Medical Center. I understand that the final arrangements will have to await your return to New York the latter part of May, and we shall be looking forward to your arrival with keen anticipation.

I believe Dr. Manson was on your suggested list for the Advisory Committee, and we shall probably ask him to join it. We are also planning to see the Medical Directors of other companies as soon as appointments can be made.

I shall appreciate any suggestions which you may have from time to time in order to prepare the way for your active participation when the final arrangements for your work with us have been made.
