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sembly unanimously approved the establishment of a federation with Libya and Syria. The move represented final endorsement of the union by Egyptian political leaders. It will be followed by a national referendum Sept. 1. Both Libya and Syria already have ratified the federation.

The State Department declined to comment on published reports that Otto Ambros, a German scientist sentenced to prison at the Nuremberg trials, has been granted a visa to come to the United States. Spokesman Charles W. Bray said that because "not all the facts are in" he was not in a position to comment or confirm that Ambros had received a visa.

Bitter fighting for control of Baisal in East Pakistan was reported by All India Radio, which said Pakistani army forces were shelling the town to try to rout rebel forces. Another radio broadcast said a Pakistani column advancing toward Ramgarh was forced to fall back under heavy rebel pressure.

Soviet transport planes brought in more military supplies to help Ceylon battle leftist insurgents. The Ceylon government announced that 60 rebels had surrendered en masse to authorities at Anuradhapra in northcentral Ceylon.
